THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH ORDAINS THAT the Ordinances of the City of Somersworth, as amended, be further amended as follows:

Amend Chapter 30, Conduct in Public Parks, Section 13, Dog Waste in Parks, by retitling this Section as follows:

Section 13. Dogs in Parks.

Further amend Chapter 30, Conduct in Public Parks, Section 13, Dog Waste in Parks, by adding the following paragraph:

(c.) Where signs are posted, dogs shall be prohibited from the designated playing fields listed here:

- **Noble Pines Park Baseball Field**
- **Millennium Park Softball Field**
- **Jules Bisson Softball/Baseball Field**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

RESOLUTION NO. 45-14 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE PURCHASE AND REDEVELOPMENT OF THE FORMER POLICE STATION SITE.

WHEREAS, the City of Somersworth owns a certain tract of land identified as Tax Map 11 Lot 210, located at 5 Main Street, also known as the site of the former City of Somersworth Police Station; and

WHEREAS, Goal 1.12 of the City's Master Plan encourages the "Renovation of the former police building"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council would like qualified developers to submit proposals for the redevelopment of the site consistent with the City's Master Plan and the revitalization of the downtown consistent with Smart Growth principals,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the City Manager is authorized to issue a Request for Proposals for the purchase and redevelopment of the former Police Station site located at 5 Main Street.
