

Dear City Council Members:

The undersigned is legal counsel to Public Service Company of New Hampshire, d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource"). Eversource has received your notice of a public hearing at which the City of Somersworth will take up the matter of a resolution by the City Council for the City of Somersworth for the amendment of existing pole licenses in the City.

This is to advise that, to the extent the proposed amendments seek to make language changes to the pole licenses of Eversource consistent with RSA 72:23, and the rulings of the New Hampshire Supreme Court in N.E. Tel. & Tel. Co. v. City of Rochester, 144 N.H. 118 (1999) and Verizon New England v. City of Rochester, 151 N.H. 263 (2004), Eversource does not intend to raise a legal objection to the amendments. However, this should not be construed as a waiver of Eversource's rights to protest, seek an abatement of, or otherwise legally challenge as excessive or disproportionate the assessment by the City of Somersworth of any incremental property tax upon Eversource's use or occupancy of the public right of ways in Somersworth, and Eversource fully reserves all such rights.

Eversource does, however, object to the proposed amendments to include the requirement that the licensee provide the City, in writing, the names and contact information for any additional providers authorized now or in the future to place equipment at these locations.

This condition is not a revision required under RSA 72:23, or the New Hampshire Supreme Court cases interpreting that statute, in order to legally assess and tax either the facilities or equipment of the named licensee, or the use and occupancy of the public right of way by the named licensee. Furthermore, such other additional providers, to the extent they may exist, are required to license or permit their facilities located within the public rights of way with the City of Somersworth pursuant to RSA 231:159, et seq., just as Eversource is. Consequently, the identity of additional providers utilizing the public rights of way, whether by attachment to existing utility poles or otherwise, should be obtainable from Somersworth's own public highway licensing records. Eversource is not aware of any statute or other provision of law in New Hampshire which authorizes the City of Somersworth to compel Eversource to provide this information as a requirement of a pole license.

We also bring to your attention that, in accordance with the requirements of RSA 374:34-a, public utilities such as Eversource must provide non-discriminatory access to their distribution poles to certain third parties seeking to use them for attachment of their own lines, cables and appurtenances. Under existing regulations of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Puc 1303.08), such third parties are required to clearly label their attachments with owner identification. This affords another means by which the City may obtain its own information pertaining to additional providers utilizing the public rights of way.

Under the above circumstances, Eversource maintains it is neither legally necessary, nor fair or reasonable, to require a licensee to provide or report to the City information about others using the licensee's poles licensed in the public right of way. Such a license amendment is not required in the public good.



My background or Interests are:

During high school my senior year included multiple shop classes. I had focused on woodworking and building trades, with the intent of pursuing a career in carpentry. After high school I found it easier to and more appealing to work in the automotive field. I have always had a hands on do it yourself attitude. I would rather fix something myself than pay someone to do it. I find it hard to find anyone that cares for the job at hand more than the actual owner. This is probably due to my attention to detail. I tend to be very picky about how work is done during any repair/construction.

In 2002 I purchased my home on Linden St here in Somersworth. The fact it is in the Historic District was not a contributing factor. I had mixed feelings about this. I do not like the idea that I can be told what I can or can't do with my hard earned property. I did like the idea that my neighborhood would not be developed with out of place buildings or businesses. I have since built a shed on my property. Having gone through the application process with the HDC, I found it to be reasonable in the two instances that I have dealt with them.

When planning both my shed and a garage I have not yet built due to financial reasons. I read and studied the HDC guidelines. In effect. My understanding is that the intent of the HDC is to have any buildings built or added on to should reflect the appearance of buildings immediately surrounding it. Both of my applications were approved in the first meeting attended. I believe this was accomplished due to my attention to detail when designing both buildings. It is all about the details. Not what it is made of, but how the completed project appears.

As a quick example, if someone proposes to use wide corner boards. That sounds great, but in reality the board measures 6" wide. That may be wide compared to the standard 4" used nowadays, but is very narrow and out of place when compared to the 12" corner boards found commonly all over the Historic District. This is just one example of how recently built houses don't end up fitting in.

Over the years I have developed more of an appreciation for the Historic District. Just like current day cars, they don't build them like they used to. I find that both older cars and houses have character that is not found in modern versions. I would like to help preserve that appearance. The property next to me is in danger of having a very out of place house built. This situation has made me want to get more involved. This application will hopefully allow me the opportunity to do more to help preserve the Historic District.
