
Pizza with the Police

Springtime Tips...

Spring is the time to cleanup garages, basements and yards. Lubricants and hazardous materials can be disposed of during advertised collection days dedicated solely to the pick-up of these items. Otherwise metal and electronic items can be dropped off at the Department of Public Works yard once stickers for disposal have been purchased at City Hall for \$4 per item.

Spring also means that citizens will be burning their downed tree limbs and garden preparation materials. A Permit is required by the State of New Hampshire for such activities and that Permit can be obtained at the Fire Department.

Prepare for Spring Clean-up!

BAGGED LEAVES AND BRUSH PICKUP

Brush will be picked up the third weeks in April and May.

You must call 692-4266 by Friday, April 13th and/or Friday, May 18th to be added to the pickup list. Please have your brush curbside no later than 7:00 am on Monday, April 16and/or Monday, May 21 for pickup. Brush can be up to five (5) inches in diameter and ten (10) feet long. PLEASE NOTE: Brush pickup is limited to 20 minutes per stop. Any remaining brush and cleanup of debris is the responsibility of the property owner.

Bagged leaves will be picked up the fourth weeks in April and May

You do not have to call ahead for bagged leaves pickup. Please have leaves curbside no later than 7:00am on your trash pickup day the weeks of April 20 and/or May 28. Leaves and grass clippings must be in brown paper leaf bags, sold at many local stores.

Malley Farm Facility

Malley Farm Facility will be opening in April for disposal of brush and leaves, weather conditions permitting. Call the Public Works Department at 692-4266 for hours of operation.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

There will be a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, May 5, 2018 from 8:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. at the Turnkey Landfill in Rochester. Residents must bring a photo ID with proof of Somersworth residency.

Oil or enamel-based paint stains and finishes Paint thinners and turpentine Weed killers and fertilizers Bug and rodent sprays Pool chemicals Antifreeze Gasoline

Items that will NOT be accepted include:

Zinc and alkaline batteries
Propane Tanks
Car batteries
Latex paint
Computers
Motor oil
Tires

Community Gardeners at Malley Farm New Steering Committee

In preparation for the upcoming spring gardening season, the Department of Public Works will host a special meeting for all returning Malley Farm Community Gardeners on Saturday, April 21, from 10am -11:30am at the City's Public Works Facility located at 18 Lilac Lane. A steering committee made up of the Gardeners was established last year to assist with managing the program and representatives of the Committee will lead the informational and sign up meeting for upcoming spring participants. The meeting is mandatory for those community gardeners planning to return to garden their assigned plot this coming year. Topics covered at the meeting will include a review of the Community Garden Rules; Completing the Garden User and Voluntary Service Agreement Forms; updating personal contact information, and a discussion about upcoming spring and fall volunteer work days. Additional information and reminders about the meeting will be sent to the current participants prior to the Saturday meeting. Those interested in participating in the Community Garden program but do not yet have an assigned garden plot are encouraged to attend.

Highway Crews to prepare for spring work details.

Highway crews will be initiating spring cleanup work as soon as the snow melts, including replacing temporary road patch material with hot mix asphalt, sweeping downtown sidewalks and all City streets. Dog Licenses Due

All dogs living in the City of Somersworth, including puppies who have received their first rabies shot, must be licensed annually, on or before April 30, in accordance with RSA 466.

Dog licenses are issued by the City Clerk's Office during normal office hours. Remember to bring the dog's current rabies certificate, if not on file, and spaying/neutering certificate, if applicable.

Fees

- Puppy (older than 3 months, younger than 7 months): \$7.50
- Male and female dogs (not spayed or neutered): \$10.00
- Spayed or Neutered dogs: \$7.50
- Group License for 5 or more dogs: \$20.00
- Commercial Kennel License for 5 or more dogs: \$20.00
- Senior Citizen (65 or over): \$2.00 (for 1 dog. Additional license(s) shall be at the regular fees)

In addition to the regular licensing fee listed above, a charge of \$1 per month will be assessed if fees are not paid before June 1.

Owners of dogs that are not licensed by July 15 may also be subject to a civil forfeiture fee of \$25.00 in addition to the fees as noted, due within 15 days of receiving notice.


