**ELDERLY & DISABLED TAX EXEMPTION
FILING PERIOD NOW OPEN
through April 15, 2020**

All applications for Exemptions and Credits must be filed by April 15th, and not afterwards, for the current tax year. The application is permanent as long as you own your home or until your financial circumstances change. The City Assessor may review your application during subsequent tax years to determine continuation of eligibility. You must notify the Assessing Staff if you no longer qualify because of changes in income or assets.

The Somersworth Kids Art Walk

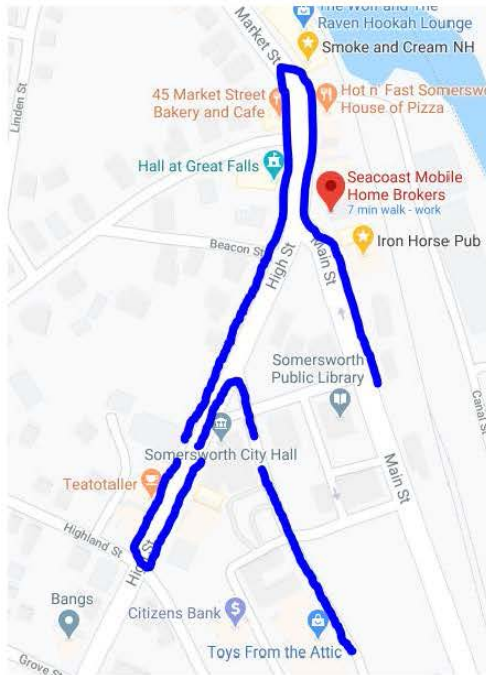

Somersworth Veterans Memorial Bricks

On June 4, 2018, Mayor Dana S. Hilliard announced the formation of the Veterans Park Memorial Commission to re-design the Stein Park Veterans Memorial on Main Street so that it would become a living tribute to all the brave men and women who answered the call of defending this great nation.

The Somersworth City Council demonstrated their commitment to the development of this living tribute by adopting a Resolution pledging their support. As part of this campaign, the City, with the support of the Somersworth Veterans Park Memorial Commission, has launched a Brick donation campaign. Bricks can be purchased by anyone wishing to honor a Veteran who has served our Country.

Bricks are 4" x 8" inches and red, which will be engraved with the name, military rank, branch and years of service for individual service members and will be selectively placed throughout the entrance walkway of the Memorial. Safety Sight Distance Improvements Made at the Intersection of Old Rochester Road and Blackwater Road

City staff worked with the NHDOT District 6 office and a property abutter on the recent removal of eight (8) very tall pine trees that were affecting sight distance at the intersection of Old Rochester Road and Blackwater Road. This intersection has been the location of several serious vehicle accidents over the recent years and was selected for a Traffic Safety Audit by the NHDOT and FHWA.

The Safety Audit evaluated several aspects of the current intersection and made specific recommendations on how to improve vehicle safety at this location. The removal of the tall pine trees on Old Rochester Road immediately south of this intersection was among the top Tier I recommendations for the City and the State DOT to implement. An agreement between the State, abutting property owner and the City of Somersworth was approved to enable the State to proceed with the tree removal.

Metal Pick-up

The Department of Public Works reminds residents that metal pick up occurs on the 2nd Tuesday of the month. The March collection will occur on Tuesday, March 10 and residents wanting this service are asked to call Public Works not later than 3:00 pm on Monday, March 9 to be placed on the pickup schedule for March. Participants are reminded to place the proper number of tags on the item when setting the item out on the street for collection. Typical TV's require three (3) stickers - \$12.00 and PC's require one (1) sticker - \$4.00. Residents may also opt to drop off metal and electronic items with proper bulky waste stickers at the Public Works Facility located at 18 Lilac Lane from 7:30 am-2:30 pm Monday – Friday.

Curbside Collection

Residents are reminded that City trash bags and recycling containers must be at the curbside no later than 7:00 am and no sooner than the evening before your designated collection day. Given schedules and possibility of inclement weather, it is not practical for our City contractor, Waste Management, to return to a street where residents missed setting out trash bags and or recycling containers. Waste Management trucks start at 7am each of the days they serve Somersworth, but

often start routes differently each week depending upon equipment, personnel, and weather conditions.

Snow Parking Bans

Residents are also reminded to refer to social media updates (email blasts, website updates) when inclement weather is forecasted for parking ban updates. The winter has contributed to potholes on some City streets and Highway crews are being dispatched to address temporary repairs on an as needed basis. Highway crews will return to those key locations for permanent repairs as the asphalt plants re-open in the spring. The Public Works Department assigns Highway crews daily to address potholes on primary streets that have been reported and or observed by the Highway staff. Chief Kramlinger joins the City of Somersworth's management team with a wealth of leadership, command, and technical expertise. He served as Fire Chief/AEMT/Emergency Management Director in Manchester-by-the-Sea, Massachusetts, Director of the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy, and as a Firefighter/Engineer/EMT-I in Dover. Chief Kramlinger is also a Senior Staff Instructor at the New Hampshire Fire Academy where he teaches in a wide variety of courses.

"We are pleased to have Chief George D. Kramlinger join the City of Somersworth management team," said City Manager Belmore, "Chief Kramlinger's extensive command experience and technical expertise in a variety of organizations will be a great addition to our management team and our Fire Department. I'm confident that his ability to lead people, prioritize resources, and increase effectiveness will enhance

public safety and build upon the Fire Department's solid reputation for operational excellence."

- Permits are required by the state to burn tree branches that have fallen over the winter or to prepare garden areas. These Permits can be obtained free of charge from the Fire Department. They outline safety for burning these materials.
- While snow accumulations are lessening, it still is possible that we could get some storms which may result in fire hydrants outside your property being buried. As always, we solicit your help in keeping fire hydrants clear of snow after storms.
- As the month progresses, increased temperatures will melt ice on ponds and streams. Take care when walking on these surfaces as ice can way with little warning at this time of year.

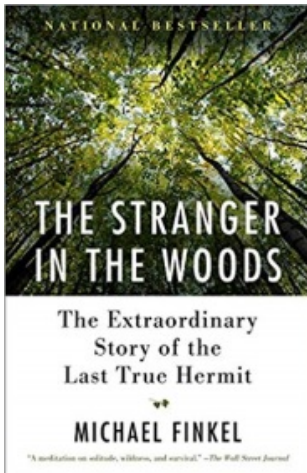

"The Stranger in the Woods"

**The Extraordinary Story of the Last True Hermit
by Michael Finkel**

Many people dream of escaping modern life. Most will never act on it—but in 1986, twenty-year-old Christopher Knight did just that when he left his home in Massachusetts, drove to Maine, and disappeared into the woods. He would not have a conversation with another person for the next twenty-seven years.

Drawing on extensive interviews with Knight himself, journalist Michael Finkel shows how Knight lived in a tent in a secluded encampment, developing ingenious ways to store provisions and stave off frostbite during the winters. A former alarm technician, he stealthily broke into nearby cottages for food, books, and supplies, taking only what he needed but sowing unease in a community plagued by his mysterious burglaries. Since returning to the world, he has faced unique challenges—and compelled us to reexamine our assumptions about what makes a good life. By turns riveting and thought-provoking, *The Stranger in the Woods* gives us a deeply moving portrait of a man determined to live his own way.
