# A) <u>Wentworth-Douglass Hospital is seeking a conditional use permit for a 1 mile long nature trail in the wetland buffer on a property located at 23 Works Way, in the Commercial Industrial (C/I) District, Assessor's Map 61 Lot 14B, CUP#08-2019</u>

The applicant continues to work with their engineering group and the NHDES and has requested a continuance.

## 4) <u>New Business</u>

# A. Palmer Gas & Oil, is seeking a Conditional Use Permit for site grading and stormwater management within the woodland buffer on a property located on <u>Gator Rock Road, in</u> the Commercial Industrial (CI) District, Assessor's Map 47 Lot 11 & 1J, CUP#02-2020

Bob Stowell (Tritech), Jody Ameden (Palmer), Peter Billipp (Palmer) are present for the applicant. The proposed project is a LPG tank facility. Total disturbance of the woodland buffer as proposed is 24% non-impervious incursion and 8.3% impervious.

Minimal tree cutting is proposed on site; the only mature trees to be disturbed are west of tank area. Species present in this area are various softwood. Some growth has occurred since the last update of the plans, but these are pioneer species and scrub pines.

Facility is LPG only; there is no liquid material at ambient temperatures/pressures. Any leak would vaporize and would not impact soil.

Water treatment would run through forebay to bio - retention area; hooded sumps would be used in Catch Basins.

The proposed site will see daily traffic; drivers will arrive, park their private vehicles and pick up their delivery vehicles; they'd then return at end of day and leave in their private vehicles. The parking area has treatment swales downstream in case of any oil drips from the drivers' vehicles

Site has a failsafe status; minimal risk of any issue. The safety system contains nitrogen and methanol, all in gaseous form. No pollutant risk beyond vehicles parked on site.

Snow storage will be placed to channel melt through treatment swales.

S. McGraw-Small notes the need to include a stamp from Gove (environmental engineer), stormwater management plan, and tree note on plans.

S. Orzechowski notes the need for plan documentation in relation to section 19.13.8 of the ordinance; city staff will assist the applicant with placing this.

## B. Sunningdale Beaver Dam

M. O'Donohue and L. Hamilton noted new beaver activity at the Sunningdale easement; this has expanded the pond on site. Appears that the dams have been tampered with by unknown individuals already, and the beavers have, predictably, rebuilt. There is some contention among neighbors regarding the impact of this rise in water levels.

S. Saunders has contacted USDA regarding management of site (they have authority as the trust agency). They'll determine management of the beavers. Will also contact UNH Coop Extension for advice.

S. McGraw-Small recommends posting that the city is contacting USDA to alert nearby landowners to the fact that the city is working on it, and to advise them not to take action on their own. Community does not have a dedicated maintenance space; developer still owns roads and maintenance structures, and he may need to perform maintenance. Any potential threat is to the houses on Firefly Circle.

S. Saunders will send a copy of the easement to the Commission.

Motion to request and recommend that city staff work with the USDA and UNH Coop to seek a resolution of the beaver dam situation: J. Rhodes, seconded by S. Mcgraw-Small

Malley Farm Cottontail release is in the works with Fish and Game; they're in the process of getting answers for city staff. S. Saunders will follow up to get answers to these administrative items. Lilac car wash on 108 has approval from PB for solar panels and is going in once building permit is in place.

Household waste is 5/16 at turnkey landfill, Isinglass Way, Rochester. Contact Public Works for questions.
