-Update on the Proposed Idling Reduction Policy

Mike presented a final draft for the policy. New employees will sign this policy upon beginning employment. Discussion was had on whether or not we could have contractors sign this as well, but the consensus was that it would make more sense to put idling requests in the contract/bidding for the contractors. The policy has been adopted, and was anticipated that it would be presented at the next Government Operations Committee meeting. Members were advised that the policy did not require action by the City Council's Government Operations Committee as this is an administrative policy the City Manager can implement.
