

Somersworth Police Officer Donald Kowalski was remembered for his service, who was killed in the line of duty on September 4, 1979 at the age of 24.

Summer Pet Safety

It takes only minutes for a pet left in a vehicle on a warm day to succumb to heatstroke and suffocation. Most people don't realize how hot it can get in a parked car. However, on a 78 degree day, temperatures in a car parked in the shade can exceed 90 degrees -- and hit a scorching 160 degrees if parked in the sun!

Even when the outside air temperature is in the 60s, temperatures inside some vehicles can reach the danger zone on bright, sunny days. Many experts recommend not leaving pets in parked cars even for short periods if the temperature is in the 60's or higher.

Animals are not able to sweat like humans do. Dogs cool themselves by panting and by sweating through their paws. Just 15 minutes can be enough for an animal's body temperature to climb from a normal 102.5 to deadly levels.

Gas Grilles

Be sure that using your gas grille does not lead to a fire.


- Keep your grille surface clean
- Keep the gas line secure and connections tight
- Keep the grille at least 10 feet away from combustibles (house, etc.)
- If the gas does not ignite, take breaks between lighting attempts
- Keep a portable fire extinguisher nearby

Fireworks

The State of New Hampshire has rules and regulations governing the use of fireworks. These are promulgated by the State Fire Marshal. Most important among these are:

- A PERMIT must be obtained from the local Fire Department.
- The landowner MUST give permission to use fireworks.
- Only those 21 and older should possess and use fireworks.
- M-80s, cherry bombs, bottle rockets, firecrackers and only smoke producing fireworks are illegal in New Hampshire and SHOULD NEVER BE USED.
- Eye protection by those igniting the fireworks is recommended.
- Light only ONE device at a time.
- Keep spectators away.
- Ignite ONLY outdoors and AWAY FROM OTHER FIREWORKS AND COMBUSTIBLES.
- Keep a fire extinguisher or garden hose handy just in case.
- Clean up debris later and any fireworks that failed to ignite. Soak these in water to disable them.
- Call "9-1-1" for any emergency accident no matter how small.
- Contact the Fire Department if you are unsure of any procedure.


News from the Department of Public Works & Utilities

- LED Light Replacement is expected to begin late next week and first full week in June. The City has entered into a contract with Affinity LED of Dover for the replacement of approximately 750 older cobra head street lights with new LED lights.
- Road reconstruction work on Indigo Hill Road, from Green Street to Davis Street, continues to progress; the project involves the replacement of a water line, some drainage improvements, new curbing and sidewalk.
- The Department was recognized by the Mayor and the City Council in conjunction with National Public Works Week, which is from May 21-27, 2017. A proclamation was read at the May, 2017 City Council meeting and brings attention to the important role public works agencies have in delivering core City services, maintaining and improving roads, sidewalks and drainage systems that assist with the quality of living in a community.

Eating and Growing at School

May 19 saw the final Farm to School fresh vegetable tasting in the schools' cafeterias. Every month since February, Cafe Services has collaborated with NH Farm to School to allow students and staff sample local vegetables. They've tried cabbage in a delicious salad with apples, carrots, cranberries, ginger and vinegar; carrots; roasted beets, and in May they sampled sauteed collard greens. To everyone's surprise, the collard greens were the favorite among students this year, and SAU 56 hopes to host monthly tastings again throughout the 2017-18 school year!

The Idlehurst gardens are growing as well. In April, with the help Grades 3-5, the Guidance Department, and the SYC after school program, spring gardens were planted. Cool temperature tolerant veggies like greens, lettuces, peas, beets, carrots, and turnips have been sprouting in the new raised beds, which were generously built and donated by the Somersworth Home Depot Lawn and Garden Department. Most of this will be harvested and enjoyed by students before the end of the school year. With enough volunteers and help, the hopes are to make these gardens a full season garden, with juicy tomatoes, shiny peppers, and hearty squashes to look forward to in the fall(as well as the beets that remain underground after their greens are enjoyed this spring).
